Perins

Last Friday Russell was asked to act as judge for the Perins School 'First Give' competition. In this, eight teams of children select a charity, devise fund raising methods, prepare a graphics presentation and carry out a collectively argued case for their charity, including their reasons for its selection. One brave pupil worked completely solo! The competition develops skills for the individuals, such as public speaking, self-confidence, team working, and increased social awareness. It was evident that there was a huge amount of commitment by all the individuals. Some of the personal stories were very moving. The winning team were presented with a cheque for £1000 for their charity. It was great to be able to encourage such voluntary efforts and I hope the children enjoyed it as much as I did. It was good to see the audience of pupils cheer on all the teams. Two of our local police had volunteered to be judges too. First Give should be congratulated on their good organisation that moved the event along on a very hot afternoon.

Parking

A parking warden turned up 7.0 in Broad Street on 23rd June and gave out tickets to two cars parked in bays used for the market stalls. This illegal parking makes life problematic for the traders setting up. My thanks to the WCC Parking Manager for responding to my request to have warders out early on market days. The parking restriction signs have been ignored for a long time. Hopefully the message will spread that this is not going to be tolerated.
